Plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement (attach separate sheet if required).

All the observations and the route map laid out by the peer team are being implemented in a phased manner. Those guide lines will take us through till the next accreditation. Besides those implementations, our plan of action was simple and straight. The motto that guided us through this academic year was: *'Improve yourself and improve the student'*.

As a result, several enthusiastic teachers volunteered to take up Ph.D. for their own sake and for the good of the college. With a view to get an A grade in the next accreditation, teachers came forward to take up the profession more academically. More departments decided to take up remedial classes to the backward students.

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Section B:**Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution**

- A) More and more teachers seemed to take part academically, like, registering for Ph.D. participating in seminars, etc.
- B) Inspired by the English department, remedial classes were taken up by other departments as well this year. Geography, Sociology and Economics departments also joined the mission.
- C) Under the initiative of Dr. Udayaravi S V, Associate professor of English, a UGC-Sponsored two-day National Seminar was organized on 23-24 August 2011. He was the convener of the seminar. Over 150 participants attended the seminar and over 25 papers were presented in two parallel sessions. This was the first National level seminar in the history of our institution. All ready other departments have started to chalk out proposals.
As our motto, 'Improve yourself and improve the student', there was an exclusive session for students for presenting papers. The proceedings of the seminar are being published in the form of a book.
- D) A Minor Research project taken up by Dr. Udayaravi S V, Associate Professor of English is going on satisfactorily. He is a co-investigator for another Minor Research project taken up by his research scholar.
- E) Each departmental library has an exhaustive question bank for students of all semesters the copies of which are made available at the college reprographic centre.
- F) Conducting Seminars within the class for students on their topics, regular tests and assignments, their corrections were made as usual for a continuous evaluation of the students.

M.Com Course has begun and is flourishing with curricular and co-curricular activities. There has been more number of admissions than expected.

Almost one lecturer from every department from our college is in the Board of Studies and Text book committees of their respective faculties. As we do not have the autonomy to be innovative in curricular design within the college, the knowledge and expertise of our senior teachers are being made use of in bringing out a substantially good text book.

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a) Concession in fee for economically weaker section:
